



THE CURRICULUM



- We offer a broad and challenging curriculum to our students, from Kindergarten to IGCSE (O-Level) and A-Level. The curriculum is adapted from the Cambridge IGCSE and the A-Level syllabi as they approach public examinations.
- Students normally select between seven to ten subjects, from a wide range for their IGCSE (O-Level) subjects, which they sit for at the end of Year 11.
- The A-Level study programme will also be re-introduced in September 2021
- As from April 1st 2020, MIS has embarked on electronic teaching and learning (eTnL) programme enabling lessons to be delivered fully online.

 Development is ongoing for a more advanced eTnL for the Term 1 Academic year 2020-2021 September start.



KINDERGARTEN

- Using the thematic Early Year syllabus (Cambridge) Pre School focuses on six areas of development: social and emotional, communication, language and literacy, problem solving, reasoning and numeracy, knowledge and understanding of the world, physical development and creative development (which includes Dance, Drama, Music and Art).

The Secondary years in Melaka International School adopts the world-recognized *International General Certificate in Secondary Education (IGCSE)* (UK) curriculum, which is the equivalent to Malaysia's SPM.

The years will be spent learning and absorbing practical knowledge and developing useful and applicable skills through a curriculum that includes career guidance and counselling.

This active approach allow students to discover their passion for learning and understanding in order to make better decisions in life when they graduate.



DESCRIPTION ON ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE

Over the last ten years, MIS has seen a consistent IGCSE academic results with a slight dip between 2012 to 2015. However, the upward performance trend was successfully maintained reaching its peak of 100% pass in 2016. This high level performance has been maintained ever since.

The percentages of distinction grades (A and A*) scored by our students since 2016 have also been commendable reaching the percentage of almost 50% in 2019. A few of our previous students such as Kuah Jia Chen (2018) won an international award for specific subjects, in his case Mandarin. Huan Hui Wen from the June 2019 examination series was amongst the top performers in the whole country.

Such performances are expected to be improved in future through various strategies namely: Electronic Teaching & Learning (eTnL); 'Blended' and 'Inquiry Learning' approaches to teaching and learning; extra support classes; personalised attention to students; and close monitoring of students' academic progress throughout their time at MIS.






