
Academic Staff of the Month

Stargazing with Mr. Saravanan: Celebrating Meteorological Day and the Equinox

For World Meteorological Day, which was on 23rd March, our school's very own Mr. Saravanan – a passionate stargazer shared fascinating insights about the vernal equinox. On 20th March 2025, at 5:01 p.m., Malaysia experienced this celestial event, where the Sun aligns directly above the Equator, creating nearly equal day and night cycles worldwide.

Mr. Saravanan's love for astronomy began in primary school and has since inspired his sons and students alike. His homemade telescope, crafted from PVC pipes and convex lenses in 1993, has a magnification of 16 times—enough to see the moon's craters! Though it now needs repairs, its legacy lives on.



The equinox, derived from the Latin *aequus* (equal) and *nox* (night), symbolizes balance. Mr. Saravanan explained how the Sun rises exactly in the East and sets in the West during this event, which occurs only twice a year. He also highlighted how sunlight refraction makes days appear slightly longer than nights.

The equinox marks the start of spring in the Northern Hemisphere, a season of renewal. Mr. Saravanan encourages students to appreciate the cosmos, reminding us that Earth's tilt and rotation shape our lives in profound ways.

Let's thank Mr. Saravanan for sharing his passion and inspiring us to look up at the stars. As he says, "The universe is vast, but it's also within our reach."

Mental Health: How Are You Doing?



Teaching is a career filled with purpose, passion, and countless moments of joy—but let's be honest, it can also be exhausting. Between lesson plans, grading, meetings, and the emotional weight of supporting students, it's easy to neglect our own well-being. Stress, burnout, and even persistent low moods (known as dysthymia) can creep in unnoticed, leaving us drained.

In a recent session titled "How Are You Doing?", our school counsellor, Ms. Priscilla shared eye-opening insights on mental health. She reminded us that self-check-ins are just as crucial as caring for our students. One key takeaway? The DASS (Depression, Anxiety, Stress Scales) inventory test is a simple yet powerful tool to gauge our emotional state. She also highlighted how our inner critic—that nagging voice of self-doubt—can magnify stress, leading to emotional exhaustion.

So, how do we protect our mental well-being? Ms. Priscilla introduced 8 essential self-care categories:

- **Physical** (sleep, exercise, nutrition)
- **Emotional** (acknowledging feelings, setting boundaries)
- **Personal** (hobbies, downtime)
- **Spiritual** (mindfulness, reflection)
- **Social** (meaningful connections)
- **Space** (a calming environment)
- **Financial** (managing stress around money)
- **Work** (balance, realistic goals)



Remember, self-care isn't selfish—it's necessary. When we prioritize our well-being, we're better equipped to inspire, teach, and support our students. So, take a deep breath, check in with yourself, and remember: You matter just as much as those you care for. Let's make mental health a priority—for ourselves and for our school community.


